
Beacon of Hope

Financial independence does wonders for an individual and his/her family. Confidence and respect are just some aspects attained. Let us share the journey of Anita with you: a mother of four, she was earning around INR 100 per day as a daily wage labourer! With this paltry income, and her husband, Gulli, supplementing the family kitty as best he could, the family was facing abject poverty.

It was a turn of luck that she got herself enrolled under the Family Strengthening Programme (FSP) – a programme by SOS Children's Villages of India (SOSCVI). With the intervention of SOSCVI, Anita joined the Maa Durga Self-Help Group, where she attended various workshops that empowered her with skill sets geared to facilitate financial independence. She also attended literacy classes and honed her calculation skills. Today, she is one of the caregivers of the Gurukul community located in Faridabad, Haryana. Anita's narrative is highlighted as the Government is consistently taking steps to ensure the upliftment of the rural poor through Self-Help Groups that aim to encourage financial independence.

SOSCVI's Family Strengthening Programme has brought about a sea of changes in the lives of many like Anita, who have had to struggle very hard to sustain their families, meet basic needs and educate their children. Today, with the basics, including health and education taken care of, hundreds of rural women can focus on fulfilling their dreams of a better tomorrow.
