Our long term customized care interventions include: Family Like Care, Family Strengthening, Kinship Care, Short Stay homes, Foster Care, Education and Youth Skilling.



Madhavi Devi resides in Uttarakhand. Her family constitutes of her husband, Mohan Lal, and their four children: the eldest daughter, Sumaya, studies in class 11, Dhruv/Arushi study in class 9, and the youngest, Vishali, studies in class 8. Madhavi Devi is a housewife; her husband works as a daily wage labourer.

HAPPYNINGS

In 2020, when the pandemic struck, Madhavi and her family were in dire straits as her husband lost his job and the family did not have any other source of income. However, learning from her previous mistakes, she decided to utilize her past knowledge of animal rearing, and requested the Family Strengthening team, Bhimtal, to support her with buffalo rearing via Income Generation Activity (IGA).

IMPACTING LIVES FOR A BETTER TODAY AND A BRIGHTER TOMORROW

The financial support helped Madhavi Devi and her family to sustain and get through extremely challenging times. With the help of the animator, she approached the Pradhan and Gram Vikas Adhikari with a request for support of an animal shed; her proposal was approved for a financial assistance of INR 35,000 in November 2020. Along with this, she also attended a training by the Animal Husbandry Department and an exposure visit to Pantnagar Dairy Plant, facilitated by SOS Children's Villages of India to enhance her knowledge in this field for better results.

Finally, with the help of SOS Children's Villages of India in April 2021, she purchased a buffalo for INR 25,000. During the second wave of COVID-19, Madhavi was in a better situation to take care of her family as she now had a daily source of income, by selling up to 4 liters of milk in the market. In addition, she was also able to provide her children with milk and other milk products like curd and paneer.

Three-day Medical Camp at CV Bhopal:

The Family Strengthening team of Bhopal, in collaboration with the Family Planning Association of India (FPAI), organized a 3-day camp on two main themes: a) Medical Camp for checking HB and b) Health and Hygiene Awareness Camp for 150 families, consisting of 300 children, whilst maintaining COVID-19 protocols. These initiatives were held as our priority in the Aredi Kresher Basti of Bhopal.
