From a very young Siddheshwar demonstrated passion for culinary arts while working in local hotels and food





Five boys from SOS Youth House Bangalore and four girls from SOS Children's Village Bangalore got selected for the 'Guardians of Dreams Scholastic Awards 2023'. Each child will receive INR 25.000 under this scholarship.





The Family Strengthening Programme team conducted a health camp at Guwahati, Chennai and Visakhapatnam for caregivers, children and community members in collaboration with regional hospitals. After the checkup, all the participants were provided with free medication as per their health conditions.



SOS Children's Village Rajpura youth house boys designed a working model of Chandrayan-3. Following which, they got an opportunity to represent the model at the Institution of Engineers (India) Chandigarh on Engineer's Day. They were rewarded for their design and concept.



Child-centric Disaster Risk Reduction training was organised by NIMHANS & NIDM, Govt of India at SOS Children's Village Bangalore. The Bangalore Village facilitated the orientation session for the participants at the campus. Coworkers from Bangalore, Chennai, Pondicherry and Nagapattinam also attended the training.



Family Strengthening Programme Bangalore conducted an Eye Checkup Camp in collaboration with the Aloka Vision Programme by Zeiss. A total of 250 programme participants along with the community members got their eyes checked. People with severe eye conditions were referred for cataract operations and those with long and short eyesight issues were provided with free spectacles.



Children from SOS Children's Village Guwahati participated in the Talent Hunt organised by the National Institute of Science and Technology (NIST) and got selected and were featured in top 15 institutions. Now they will be showcasing their project in front of eminent jury constituted by NIST. All the operational cost for this will be borne by NIST.



Family Strengthening Programme, Latur celebrated the National Poshan Maah 2023 in collaboration with ICDS and the local primary school at Harwadi Cluster. The objective of this was to educate caregivers and community members about the importance of nutritious meals in shaping women's and children's mental and physical health. An informative training session was conducted for the programme participants.



Children of the **Bal Panchayat** along with the members of the **Self-Help Group** from **Family Strengthening Programme Bawana** conducted an awareness campaign at the Shahbad Dairy cluster. They raised awareness within the community on **climate change** through a rally and street play. They also creatively reused plastic waste to make utility items such as fans and posters.



Family Strengthening Programme Begusarai, programme participants have succeeded in availing the benefit given by the government under the scheme of the E-shram Card. A total of 23 girls, studying in high school, have received monetary funds for purchasing cycle. Also, 4 boys received INR 10,000 each for securing 60% and more in their 10th exam. Apart from this, the family will receive INR 50,000 after the girl reaches the eligible age of marriage.



Family Strengthening Programme Chennai conducted a session for the children of the Bal Panchayat on Climate Change in association with Hindu College. The session aimed to raise awareness, encourage sustainable practices, and foster a sense of responsibility towards the environment among the participants. They also organised a 'Community Cleaning Drive' with the support of 'Tambaram Corporation' and the local ward members of the community.



Youth House boys from SOS Children's Village Rajpura got a chance to watch the live ODI World Cup Match in Mohali between India and Australia. A total of 26 youths including the staff of the village got free tickets for the match. It was an amazing experience for the children.
