Her hard work and dedication paid off when she was selected as a resource for an online baking workshop. She landed her first job at ITC Fortune Group Dalhousie, Himachal Pradesh, and is currently working with Welcome Hotel by ITC Hotel/Bella Vista in Panchkula.

Shalini is a Culture Champion, having received the certificate of recognition for her outstanding work in the first quarter of 2023. This is not the first time she has achieved this recognition; she was also named Culture Champion in the last quarter of 2022.

## From housewife to successful entrepreneur

Chaya, a housewife struggling to make ends meet, was welcomed to the Family Strengthening Programme, after which she joined the Self-Help Group 'Sankalp Mahila Bachatgat'. She started saving monthly. After receiving the right financial guidance from the Self-Help Group, she started saving



monthly and was a regular at capacity building sessions, which prompted her to start her own business. She received income generation support to start a boutique. Her talent for design got her many orders, and with the help of her husband, she merged her businesses and invested in buffalo rearing.

Chaya then associated with the Mann Deshi Foundation, learnt how to mass produce papads and through a subsidy, invested in a papad-making machine. Through her various initiatives, her dream remains to educate her children and give wings to their ambitions.

## Highlights of the month

Family Strengthening Programme Chennai organised an awareness session on Cyber Safety for caregivers and children. The session was attended by 50 participants. The aim of the session was to promote a secure online environment and equip caregivers with tools to guide children.



Family Strengthening Programme Latur organised awareness Chief Minister session on the Generation **Employment** Programme (CMEGP) and various schemes. Caregivers Government from Navjivan and Samarth Self-Help Groups participated in the session.



An **essay competition** was organised by the Vigilance Department of the Food Corporation of India at SOS Children's Village Guwahati as part of the Vigilance Awareness Week 2023. The topic of the essay was 'Say No to Corruption: Commit to the Nation'. 40 children participated in competition and the top performers received prizes and certificates.



Family Strengthening Programme Bhopal organised a 'Bal Mela'. This initiative was taken by the local NGO National Institute of Women, Child and Youth Development (NIWCYD) in association with UNICEF, to celebrate the week's occasion of safety and security of children. The event witnessed the participation of 459 children in various art and clay competitions.



23 boys from the Youth House in Thrissur Children's Villages were given a tour of the Kerala Police Academy. They had an amazing experience interacting with the K9 Dog Squad and were shown around various places in the academy, such as the Model Police Station, Academic and Research Wing, Parade Ground. The academy administration and career opportunities were also explained to them.



Vaibhav Tambat, the first child raised in SOS Children's Village Alibag, won the Bal Snehi Award in the 'Care Leaver with Exemplary Achievement' category. The Ministry of Women and Child Development Maharashtra, along with the State Commission for Protection of Child Rights and UNICEF, organised the event. Vaibhav, 24, is currently pursuing a fully funded PhD in Marine Science at the National Kaohsiung University of Science and Technology in Taiwan.



SOS Children's Village Begusarai organised an exposure visit for students of class 8 to 12 to Varun Beverages Ltd, which is a PepsiCo bottling plant. The students were educated about the safety and standard operating procedures of food and beverage production. They were then taken on a guided tour of the manufacturing units of Pepsi products.



SOS Children's Villages India celebrated Child Safety and Child Rights Week across its 40+ programme locations in India. The week aimed to promote awareness on child safety and child rights, empowering children to exercise their rights. Activities included workshops on child safety, storytelling sessions, art competitions, street plays and sports events on the theme 'For Every Child, Every Right'.



Family Strengthening Programme Chennai conducted a Menstrual hygiene session for adolescent girls. A medical officer from Greater Chennai Corporation was invited as a resource person. The session aimed to empower girls with knowledge about their reproductive health to ensure their overall well-being.



Family Strengthening Programme Guwahati organised a free medical camp in collaboration with Marwari Hospital. The camp was attended by more than 100 participants who received free medicines and underwent necessary health checkups. This event was aimed at promoting community well-being.



Family Strengthening Programme Bangalore distributed nutritional materials among the children residing at Indira Gandhi Colony. The distribution was based on the HB and BMI tests conducted to identify children with low HB and severe BMI levels. A total of 84 children received the materials.



**50 Children** from **SOS Children's Village Guwahati** visited the **Guwahati Airport**. They were warmly welcomed during the visit. They also got a tour of the domestic terminal, greenhouse, runway and airport traffic center.




