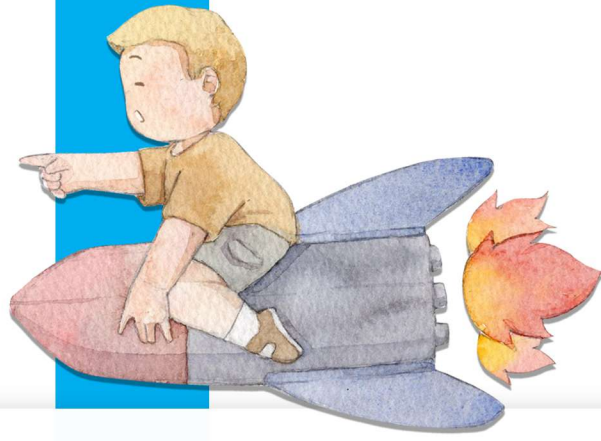

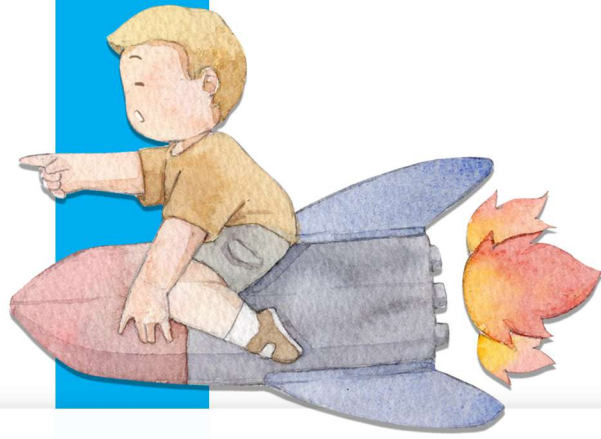


Family Strengthening

- **Begusarai** | 35 caregivers from Asurari clusters completed a 10-day certified training on dairy farming and vermicompost with RSETI, empowering women entrepreneurs.
- **Latur** | Organised an exposure visit for 40 caregivers to Krishi Vigyan Kendra to promote backyard kitchen gardening for better family nutrition.
- **Vizag** | Conducted a climate change awareness program where 35 participants pledged eco-friendly practices and committed to planting one tree each.
- **Bhopal** | Held a 10-day advanced skill training program in food processing, empowering caregivers to expand their livelihood opportunities.

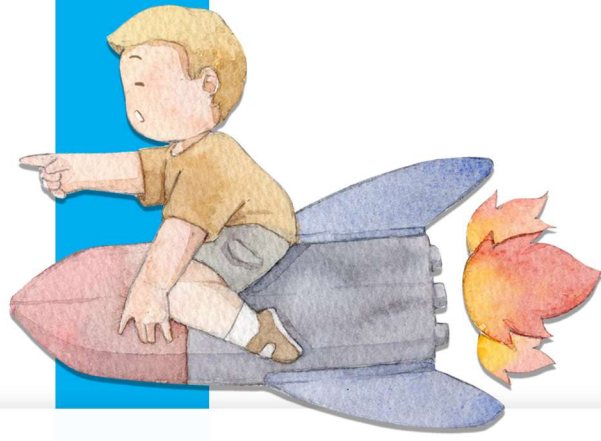
